The indicative areas defined in the scope of the journal are Accounting, auditing, taxation, management accounting, business management, ethics, governance, financial reporting (including integrated and sustainability), risk management, current issues facing the profession and any other issues of interest to stakeholders of accountancy profession. For this call, authors should consider drafting their manuscripts to cover wider practical issues including but not limited to:

- standard setting, exposure drafts, adoption, implementation and impact of local and international financial reporting standards
- governance, risk management and ethical issues
- technological developments including artificial intelligence and block chain
- Integrated and sustainability reporting requirements.

By publishing papers through AJ, the authors' research output will be shared to a wider accountancy profession community without paying for publication fee. In addition, the AJ offers award for the best paper that provides critical insight to the accountancy profession.
